The parade will step off at 10 a.m. on Saturday, March 17. Assembly for the parade is on Radcliffe Street at 9 a.m. Entrance to Radcliffe Street should be made from Rutledge Avenue. Parade marshals will direct participants to the club's spot in the route. The position number will not be determined until right before the parade and will be emailed to club members as soon as possible. The parade route is Radcliffe to King Street, King Street to Broad Street, ending at the Cathedral of St.John the Baptist on Broad. Cars should be decorated. Throwing of beads or candy is not allowed.

Restoration of that non-British car

A little over a year ago, the December 2016 issue to be exact, I wrote an article in the Windscreen about my 1958 190sl Mercedes I started restoring. Well a year later I'm glad to say that I'm back at it. Somehow gutting and putting in a new kitchen took priority. About a month ago I got out the grinder and started removing paint to get a better idea of how much work I had ahead of me. I knew someone had done a lot of body work on the car and changed the color from black to red. Well I found a lot of very bad body work. In places the repair method was mix up a pound of bondo and fill the holes. There were places



with bondo over an inch thick. One byproduct of my grinding was covering everything in the garage with a layer of bondo dust. So I put up a wall to separate the 190sl bay from the rest. I recently installed AC/Heating so I can work on the car in any weather.

Now for the British part of my story. The yellow thing below is my new English Wheel. It was invented in Britain in the early 1900's. After beating a panel into a shape using a mallet and leather covered sand bag, the English Wheel is used to smooth the metal and to perfect the shape. I have new sheet metal for the floorboards and a patch panel for the right rear quarter panel and a corner on the left side. The rest of the sheet metal I have to form myself using this method.







Sausage casserole has never been simpler to make than with this easy recipe combining cannellini beans, plum tomatoes and potatoes into one delicious dish. Plus, it's ready in under an hour! Give sausages a smoky flavour by braising them in a tomato and paprika sauce. This sausage and bean casserole recipe serves 4-6 people and is perfect if you've got a lot of people to feed and want to do it cheaply and with no fuss.. Leftovers can be stored in an airtight container in the fridge for up to 2 days, but make sure you reheat thoroughly before serving. This casserole is perfect served with crusty bread for dipping.

- 1tbsp olive oil
- 8 thick sausages
- 1 onion, peeled and cut into slices
- 2 garlic cloves, peeled and finely chopped
- 1 leek, washed and cut into thick slices
- 2 medium potatoes, peeled and cut into chunks (approx 450g)
- 2tsp smoked paprika
- 2 x 400g tins plum tomatoes
- Splash of red wine
- 200ml beef stock
- 350g cannellini beans (drained weight)
- Salt and pepper
- Small handful of flat-leaf parsley or chives, chopped
- Crusty bread, to serve
- 1. Heat the oil in a large sauté pan and fry the sausages for 8-10 mins, turning frequently until browned all over. Remove from the pan, cut in half and set aside.
- 2. Drain any excess oil from the pan then add the onion and garlic and sauté for a few minutes to soften. Add in the leeks, potato and smoked paprika and cook for 4-5 mins.
- 3. Pour in the tomatoes, red wine and stock and bring to the boil. Reduce the heat and return the sausage pieces to the pan, along with the cannellini beans. Cover with a lid and cook for 20-25 mins over a low heat, stirring occasionally. Remove the lid and continue to cook for a further 5-10 mins.
- 4. Season to taste, and scatter with parsley or chives. Serve the sausage casserole with warm crusty bread.


