Welsh coal miners affected by black lung disease found work producing the Junior Forty 'J40' pedal car between 1950 and 1971. Workers at the Austin Motor Company's "Junior Car Factory" in Bargoed, Wales, produced this high-end pedal car using scrap materials from the Austin A40 Devon and Dorset production process. The J40 features an openable hood and trunk, spare tire, working horn, and battery powered lights.

Online auctions, virtual car shows and a host of new ideas to enjoy one's hobby or just life in general are popping up every day. I got interested in pedal cars a couple of years ago when trying to find some for Cars on Kiawah's Kids Display. Much to my amazement, I found that a whole industry had sprung up around these little cars. They are restored, reproduced, and preserved just like the full-size versions they were designed to replicate. Pricing is interesting with some reproductions being a few hundred dollars and some original cars in the thousands. Some as much as a real car!

The RM June online auction for pedal cars caught my eye and I started checking out the cars, much as I have done in the past when hunting a new full-scale toy. 
