

I also do research to try to make the Sticker correct to the car as possible. I do the work and then send the owner a draft for them to look over and make any changes they want until they are happy with the Sticker.

The owner then can choose from Laminated, Non-Laminated, or both. I print them on the original Window Sticker Label paper that the Manufacture uses as of today. I do not charge for the Window Sticker Until the Owner has received the approved Window Sticker. I will then send the owner a PAYPAL invoice.

Here is the cost for the 2021 year.

- A. 1-Laminated for \$38.00
- B. 1-Not laminated for \$33.00
- C. Add a second laminated for \$28.00
- D. Add a second non-laminated for \$23.00






British Car Day Welcome Reception Venue


