We got the car all back together last Saturday morning. Jane and I took the car for a drive and all went great. The clutch worked perfect and didn't need any adjusting. I had noticed that the distributor clamp was not preventing the distributor from rotating. We fixed this and timed the engine. Sounds much better and starts up much easier now.

We're going to keep the ball rolling by starting work on Alex Toline's 1978 MGB. Alex joined the club in January. Alex inherited the car from his brother. The car hasn't been driven or even started in a while. Alex contacted me for suggestions of where to take the car, but he really wanted to be involved in the work. I suggested a place to take the car and also suggested maybe doing a series of Tech Sessions. This was Alex's preference. So starting in a week or two, we'll borrow Peter Steeles trailer and bring the car to my garage. We'll first go through the car to scope the project. We'll look at all the rubber in the car, including the flexible brake lines, slave cylinder line and coolant lines. We'll look at the brake cylinders, master cylinder, brake pads and wheel bearings. We'll then change the oil and filter in the engine. We'll pull the plugs, squirt a little oil in the cylinders then try to hand crank the motor. We'll check the points and get it started.

We'll break the task of getting the car reliably back on the road into multiple Tech Sessions. The first will be to assess the status of the car and order parts. When we set the date for the first Tech Session, I will send out an email blast. If you want to come just to watch and learn, that is fine. We want to keep it safe so we will limit the number of people. All must wear masks. Hopefully the weather will be nice and we can keep the garage doors open.

Millie and I are working on a rally for the spring. We'll start in Mt Pleasant and probably end at our house in Yonges Island. It will be about an hour drive during which you will identify points along the way. It will be best to have a driver and a navigator. The navigator will keep you on track as well as help document the points you need to find. Each identification will be assigned a number of points. I'll drive the route going the speed limit and points will also be given to who comes closest to my travel time. The person with the highest number of points will be declared the winner.

# P's Corner Well,

Either I'm getting old, or 2021 is passing unusually quickly - March already!!

To borrow from Kurt Vonnegut, 'busy, busy, busy'. As I write this the temperature is approaching 70 F on a clear sunny day (and Millie is planning excuses to get out and drive). Lets not talk about the Norton, but the TD has been under wraps since the Mount Pleasant Christmas Parade and is due for some Spring Preparations. She deserves an oil change, chassis lubrication wouldn't hurt, tire pressure and brake adjustment, seems like there's something else...

Dashpot Oil. It's easy to forget that this is a consumable. Just like brakes and tires, but far less obvious and easy to forget about. Whether you have a PMC or an LBC, if it's carbureted, odds are you have a miniature shock absorber in the top of each carb (the dashpot), which requires oil. Not much, but some. I won't go into the arcane mixtures & special recipes that can be used; the bottom line is that without sufficient oil the carburetor piston will rise too rapidly on acceleration, with a resulting negative effect on engine performance. So, consult your sommelier or the interwebs and make sure there's something appropriate in the dashpot...

Recruit, recruit! There are some interesting Defenders showing up in town, and of course, lots of new Minis. We have plans, opportunities, there's a vaccine - this year's going to be FUN!






### Looking for help with The Windscreen


