DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know that **American racing legend Carroll Shelby** was indirectly responsible for the motorway speed limit in Britain?

British car maker **AC** had been quietly making cars at its facility to the south of London since 1901, including in the fifties a pretty roadster called the **Ace**. The two-seater then got the attention of retired American racing driver **Carroll Shelby**, who had a dream of making a supercar that could beat the Corvette and even the mighty Ferrari on track.

So, Shelby bolted a **Ford V8** engine on to the Ace chassis and renamed the car the **Cobra**. It was pretty and exceptionally fast, both on and off the circuit. The Cobra was also blamed for the imposition of the motorway **speed limit in Britain**, after a test driver was clocked at **185mph on the M1** in a race-tuned coupe.

1967 TRIUMPH TR4A

A TR4A with a Tale or Two to Share...

n case you haven't noticed, I'm a great looking TR4A currently owned by Irene Breland. I was commissioned in October 1966 and sent to the colonies to become some lucky new owners pride and joy. I landed at Joe Cam's Autorama in Reading, PA the 1st part of 1967. On February 4, 1967 I became the pride and joy of a school teacher named Mary Kay Steigerwalt who kept me for 30 years. She also kept all my paper-work including my window sticker and bill of sale. I have lots of history or provenance as collectors are prone to say.

My next caretaker was an Auto exec out of Detroit named Mike Simon who was looking for a Triumph like me to restore. I hit the jackpot with him. If you look at the picture book of my restoration and the binder with all the receipts you will see that I was made better than new when he was done. My frame off restoration was

completed in 2000, and I won my 1st Gold at the Tour d' Elegance at the Meadowbrook Historic Races in Waterford Hills, MI. In 2002 I won Gold at the Vintage Triumph Register National Convention in Red Wing, MN. After several years of adventures with Mike and his Triumph club I moved to Florida, and Dr. Cyril Ling took over as my new caretaker. He continued showing and driving me to club events and won another Gold in 2007 at the Vintage Triumph National Convention in Valley Forge, PA. In 2009 I was sold to George Auxier who only kept me till 2010. Rumor has it from Hayes at Wire Wheel, where I hung out for a few months, was that George wanted a Big Healey! Well I quickly found a new home in SC when my current long time caretaker snatched me up in September 2010. Irene has done a pretty good job of keeping me in tip top shape while driving and showing me regularly around the region. It's helpful that she listens to BCCC club members in keeping me happy!

Okay, okay... I admit I got a great car with this TR4A and that I enjoy the heck out of it. I too have added a few awards to this cocky car's binder, and his provenance is likely to continue to grow as I have no plan to pass him

LBC TECH by Dave Rosato

On Friday July 8th we worked on **Frank Neill's Midget**. Like pretty much all the Tech Session cars, we went through it looking at suspension parts, brakes, clutch, lubrication, leaks, exhaust hangers, lights, horn, gauges and everything else looking for problems to fix. There are mainly two types of fuel pumps, one that continually clicks keeping up fuel pressure to the carbs, and ones that only click when the fuel pressure drops to a level. Frank wanted to switch to the latter. It took a while to get the pump primed and pumping fuel (which was supposed to be unnecessary) but we did. The car drove fine until the drive home when it appeared to starve for fuel at high speeds. Frank contacted the manufacturer who sent a replacement. During Todd Young's Tech Session we replaced the pump. We had similar problems getting the pump to prime, but did. In addition to the pump we added a front sway bar, greased the car, fixed the horn and flushed the clutch fluid.

On Saturday July 30th, we had a Tech Session on **Todd Young's Spitfire**. We replaced the fuel sending unit, greased the car and fixed the inside driver's door handle. We drove the car to check out shifting into 2nd gear. When you try to shift quickly, you hear gears grinding indicating syncromesh gear issue. When you shift slowly it goes into gear fine. **Gene Carter** said he had similar issues with his Spitfire and replacing the gear oil with **Red Line MT-90** solved the problem. We drove to three auto parts stores and couldn't find any. **Frank Wissman** volunteering to track some down. In going through the car, we decided that the car needed new brake pads, steering boots, trunk light bulb and tie rod ends. Todd is going to buy them and we'll have another Tech Session when they arrive.

The saga on **Randy Dickinson's MGTD** continues. In the June *Windscreen* I said I was hoping to report in the July *Windscreen* that all was set and the engine was installed and running great. Well, were not quite there. The TD cylinders have been bored by **Simmons**. Pistons were purchased from **Moss Motors**, but they didn't have matching rings. With the invaluable help from **Frank Wissman**, rings are being custom

made. New valve guides are being pressed into the head. The existing valves and springs are going to be reused. The head has been ground flat. The crankshaft has been ground and new bearings are being orders.

All the parts needed for the transmission have been purchased. Below are the three parts attributing to the jumping out of forth gear. The left picture below shows the 3-4th gear shifter shaft. Spring loaded steel balls ride along the detents. But you can see that for some unknown reason, someone had ground the right detent wider than it should be. The middle picture is the 3-4th gear Striking Dog. The gear selector fork shown in the right picture rides in the groove of the Striking Dog. From the significant wear on the right side of the groove and the significant wear on the selector fork, this resulted in significant play in the location of the Striking Dog. Between this play and the grinding of the detent, this caused the Striking Dog to move enough to come out of gear. My guess is that the previous owner of the car drove with his hand resting on the gear shift, continually pressing the fork against one side of the Striking Dog, causing the wear. The three parts are being replaced.

New springs and balls were purchased for under the Striking Dog and the three for the three shifter shafts. Two balls were also purchased that go between the three shifter shafts, circled in red below. When the transmission was disassembled, these ball bearings were missing.

So once again, I'm hoping I'll be able to report that the transmission will be reassembled and the engine is also assembled, or at least is being assembled. If you are interested to be at the assembly, I'll be sending out an email when it will be.



Should the Kill Switch Be Hooked Up Positive or Negative to the Battery?

We Consider Both Options

There's considerable controversy over whether it's best to hook up the master-shutoff ("kill") switch to the battery's positive or negative side. NHRA rules still mandate a positive-side hookup, but most stock-car sanctioning bodies want the kill switch on the negative side. I vote for the negative side if it's legal. On a switch connected through the positive side, the exposed terminals on the back of the switch or a broken positive cable could contact the sheetmetal or frame during a crash, creating a short



to ground and safety hazard. The negative cable connects to the body ground already—so there's no additional danger if it rubs. It's the same principle as why you should always disconnect the battery's negative side first before performing electrical service.


