## **Rebirth of the Sunbeam Marque**

This is a particularly interesting story for all British Car enthusiasts and as a Sunbeam enthusiast, I'm thrilled to share this news with you.

Last month I had the pleasure of traveling to England with a couple of Tigers EAST Alpines EAST members to research the history of the Sunbeam Marque at the Rootes Archive Centre Trust at Wroxton near Banbury, UK. This is the permanent, international home for everything Rootes: historic records, vintage advertising material, and original design/engineering drawings and documentation. I was there to research and develop a Sunbeam Timeline in preparation for the BCCC's recognition of the Sunbeam Marque at this year's British Car Day, and to compliment the 60th Anniversary of the Sunbeam Tiger.

It was there that I learned from the Archive Center's Curator, Andy Bye, that Stellantis N.V., a multinational automotive manufacturing company, formed in 2021 by the merger of Fiat-Chrysler and the French Peugeot SA Group, was planning on reviving the Sunbeam Tiger name. The details of the rebirth are still being negotiated, but I was told that PSA has been seriously talking with a Long Island, NY based company, Bridgehampton Motor Sports, to take on the project.



Donald Connolly, a New York real estate developer and owner of Bridgehampton Motor Sports, contacted PSA a few years ago to discuss a deal that would bring the Tiger of the '60's back from retirement. Working with the engineers from Stellantis and design specialists from the Eurocar Circuit, Connolly wants to create a totally modern car with all the appeal of the Tiger from the '60s. Connolly said, "This car will have the punch of a muscle car, the look reminiscent of a Tiger, and handle like a go-kart." He has already constructed a prototype by com-

puter modeling and reverse engineering the Mk 1A, and has virtually tested the car using Al data points to isolate weaknesses and make design modifications. Proposed development plans are ready to be implemented at Connolly's BridgeWerks shop in NY pending a licensing agreement with PSA.





I am excited about the prospects of having a reincarnated Sunbeam Tiger much like I was when Ford introduced retro Mustang and BMW made Mini Coopers the success that they are today. I can only hope that everything works out well for Connolly before I become too old to get my over-weight and aging frame into a low-slung sports car cockpit the way I could easily do 60 years ago.



## **COVER CAR STORY**

1967 Morgan Plus 4 Four Seat Tourer by Ken and Pat Kreuzer

Our Morgan was dispatched from the Picker-sleigh Road factory on January 28, 1967. It was ordered by a customer who specified the unusual Kingfisher Blue color but he apparently never picked up the car. A doctor from northern California saw the car in the showroom of a London dealer and bought it and had it shipped to the states. Because the car was never meant for the American market, it has right hand steering and only a four digit serial number – 6417. According to the Morgan factory, the car was originally ordered with the following options: wire wheels, heater, rear bumper, luggage rack and tonneau cover. Like all Plus 4s, it had a Triumph TR4 engine.

The car lived in California with the original owner



until his passing and was purchased by a dealer and moved to Connecticut in early 2006. We purchased the car in March, shipped it to our home in Boston with 41,520 miles on the odometer and started a reconditioning program to make it reliable once more. This process included a new tonneau cover and fitting a new old stock hood which had never been mounted to the car. New Halogen headlamps and LED taillights were added to make our little car more visible. New tires and seatbelts to be safer.

As you can imagine, registering a car these days

without a VIN number can be an issue. We've had difficulties with both the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the State of South Carolina. In SC, we were at the counter for an hour while they tried to figure out how to enter the car info. After that, we had to wait some more while they faxed the paperwork to the State Police in Columbia to run a manual check on the stolen car database even though we had a Massachusetts title in hand. A few weeks later, after the SC title arrived, I decided to get the same vanity plate we had in Massachusetts. Same deal at the SC DMV – a long wait at the counter, and they still had to fax the paperwork to Columbia. Even with the new SC title!

A few years later, the registration renewal doesn't come in the mail. We talked to the county who sent the info to the DMV – so, another trip and long wait at the counter. This time no one could figure out what happened, so copies of everything had to be sent to headquarters. It turns out they thought our car was a trailer. In SC, if you register a trailer with-





out a serial number they generate one for you. Well, they managed to give someone's trailer the same serial number as our car! It took a few weeks for their computer experts to figure that one out.

Starting March 2008, the car spent a month being repainted in the original color of Kingfisher Blue. Areas in the spare tire well were hidden from the sun so enabled the painter to match the original. A repaint was needed even though we wanted to keep the car as original as possible because the previous owner polished it through the original paint, and in some areas even the primer, over the years. I guess he doesn't like painting louvers because that will be the first and last Morgan he ever does. On a trip to Australia, we bought sheepskins for the seats. The company owner was disappointed we didn't have the Morgan there to show him.

The car has been used in photography classes and by brides to arrive in at a couple of weddings. Being a four seater, we've taken many for their first ride in a little British car. At car shows, it may not be

the fanciest, but it is the most loved.

During our ownership in Boston, we've driven the Morgan through all the New England states and upstate New York. Since we moved to Summerville in May of 2014 the car has seen the Carolinas, Georgia and Florida. We've put more than 20,000 miles on the car so far during our ownership. We didn't realize it when we bought the Morgan, but one of the best experiences was all the great people we've met thru the years as members of Morgan 3/4 Group, the Morgan Owners Group South, and especially The British Car Club of Charleston, many of which have become lifelong friends.





## Al Morgan's 1978 Midget Part III

As always, there was a surprise. In this case, as soon as we started to install the crank, the bolts on the middle bearing cap felt wrong. A quick look showed that the middle bearing cap was broken, so we sourced a set of caps and cleaned the middle one up and sent everything back to **Simmons Balancing** to be line bored. In **Figure 1** below you can see how rusty the caps were and how well **Evapo-Rust** cleaned up the one we needed.



While waiting for the block, I checked all of the piston ring gaps, only one was too small by about .002", so I filed it to size and de-burred it, then I loaded all the pistons with their rings, waiting to be installed (see Figure 2).

The replacement cap had a lateral offset, so it was welded up and machined on one face and machined on the other – then line bored to perfection (see Figures 3A and 3B).

Finally, it was time to have a tech session to install the rotating assembly! (see Figure 4A and 4B)

First, we checked all of the main bearing clearances and happily – we are good to go. OK, I'm







leaving out that the back bearing didn't squeeze the **Plasti-Gage** at all. Because I installed only 5 of the 6 bearing shells...the usual mirth followed – sigh. OK, when all the parts are installed, we're fine. The bearings are well lubricated with **Childs & Alberts Assembly Lube** (now **Childs & Akerly**), and the crankshaft spins freely when all caps are fully torqued (**see Figure 5**). We flip the engine over and start installing the pistons. I did the first two and **Al** did the last two – couldn't be easier since I've adopted **Andy Beale's**

method of tapping around the edge of the piston rather than trying to drive it in with a sharp blow to the center of the piston (see Figure 5).

The next session had **Al**, **Gene**, and **Frank** – a great size group since we are all around the same engine, ③. The day before **Al** and I installed the front plate which necessitated popping off the cam chain and gears. No problem, we got that buttoned up and decided to the install the timing chain cover, too. The first task is to install the head, I had cleaned and





chased the threads of all the studs, so we placed the gasket on the block and **Al** and **Gene** lower the head on (see Figure 6).

We torqued the head studs in two steps and presented the rocker arm assembly. While tightening the nuts, one of them stripped well before the torque setting, so we put this part of the build on hold. I find that the stud had stripped, so we order a stud and all new nuts. Next is the rear seal and oil pan. The rear seal is in an aluminum carrier


that bolts up to the back, which is where the engine stand attaches – luckily, we had plenty of room using a ¼" drive swivel head ratchet (see Figure 7).


Then using some sealant on the 4 discontinuities in the sealing surface plus the pan gasket, we attached the oil pan. It's always a good feeling to

cover up the top and bottom of the block!

Later, the new rocker assembly stud and a few miscellaneous parts come in. **Al** and I finish up the rocker arms and set the valve clearances (see Figure 8).

The oil pressure relief assembly, oil filter mounting bracket, and fuel pump bypass plate are added, (see Figures 9A and 9B) and I'm still trying to figure what fasteners go where on the front – but we've made progress!

### **Ides of March Tech Session**

We had one specific and one broad task – change the felt spacer in the steering column of **Gary Brown's MGA** and keep plugging away on **Logan Black's MGB**.

I dove in on **Gary's** steering column, and **Dave & Co.** did more work on the exhaust, including modify the hangers. On an MGA, the steering column has a pad of ~1/8" felt wrapped around it and this is located in a long metal tube. Over time the felt compresses and some play is felt in the steering wheel. The instructions say to remove the steering wheel and pull out the old felt, then simply grease up the new felt and push it in. I just can't see how that is done, the felt just bunches up.



So, I decide to remove the steering column by undoing the universal joint in the engine bay – voila – the steering column pulls right out and its almost easy to grease up the felt, wrap it around the steering

column and push it in the tube. What isn't as easy is getting the splined shaft lined up in the engine bay so the hole in the universal joint that has a cross bolt in it is also lined up. A few minutes of fiddling and we are done.



We make a quick guess on how the steering wheel lines up with the wheels and **Gary** takes it out for a check drive. The steering wheel and the wheels don't quite match yet, and **Gary** refits the wheel until it is spot on! **Frank Neill** figures out how the horn button attaches, and we wrap up on **Gary's MGA**.

I join the gang on **Logan's B** and we start on the radiator fan switch. We have done a few of them by now, it lets the driver turn on the fan before the ther-

mostatic switch kicks in, say you're in a parade and you want to be sure you don't overheat – turn the fan on before it's actually needed, and you're set. **Logan** picked spot for the switch under the dashboard, wires were run, the switch is installed, and we're stumped again.

## **LBC TECH** by Mark Mohan

### **New BCCC Member Tech Session**

For those of you who were at the February BCCC meeting, you witnessed my greeting to the club. As frustrating as it was to have my **TR4** get hit in the parking lot, it was a great way to be forced to jump headfirst into the welcoming **BCCC family**. After about a day of shock, frustration, and irritation, these emotions faded and were replaced with relief, excitement, and anticipation. This change occurred when I remembered why I got the **TR4** - to learn about classic cars, to teach my kids about cars, and to have fun driving. With this realization, I was excited to talk with **Dave** and figure out when I could bring my **TR4** over for a tech session.

In the days leading up to the tech session at **Dave's garage**, my anticipation grew as I would soon get to begin on my new adventure. And then I got to experience another under-appreciated part of owning an LBC - driving 25 miles with the top down in sub 40°F weather. But it was worth it.

Just before hypothermia kicked in, I rolled into Dave's garage and was welcomed by Dave and fellow members Frank Neill, Tom Meservey, and Parish Chapman. 


