1968 MGB GT by Tom Moschel

M y first experience seeing a Little British Car (LBC), as I remember it, was in the summer of 1967. I was only in the seventh grade and all of about twelve years old. My older brother came home and drove down our family's long driveway in this Red, Curvy with lots of Chrome car. It was a Triumph Spitfire. At that time I was not sure what it was. I had never seen anything so cool. It made me look inside and see the dash gauges, steering wheel, bucket seats and oh yes, the stick shift knob with that little emblem that I knew nothing about. Need I say more I was hooked and could not get enough. My brother asks if I wanted to see the engine. Well, he popped the hood by raising the whole front end

in the reverse direction – I had not seen anything like this and was truly amazed. I stood there looking in amazement at the engine compartment (Under the Bonnie). I can still smell that odor coming out of the car engine compartment, as it had that unique smell of hot oil and coolant. I knew from that moment on that I was going to somehow find a way to own one.

The next thing I know my brother said let's take a ride and see what she can do. I got in and put my seat belt on and it felt like I was sitting on the ground. Kinda crazy and cool all at the same time. He started the car up and then it all came together. It was a feeling of excitement, something that was not normal. I remember driving through the curves and straightaways and hearing the shifting of the transmission. We were driving along and then suddenly it looked like smoke was coming from under the hood. Yes, it was also my first experience of an LBC overheating. In the cars defense it was a hot day and yes, my brother was showing me how the car runs. As it went, we waited until it cooled down to running temperature. Now I understand why you cannot run an LBC hard on a hot day.

Moving to 1968 I did not think that things could

get any better than the 67' Spitfire. Then my brother came home with a 1968 Triumph TR 250. Well, the bar was just raised and I could not believe my eyes. It was a Jasmine Yellow with a Butternut Tan interior. Brand New and looked it too. Again, I was hooked on the British Style – it was so "British." I asked my brother for a ride and boy it proved to better than the last. That day was forever embedded in my mind.

Fast forwarding through the next fifty years of my life with school, career, marriage, and children/ grandchildren. It takes me to the fall of 2015 in Lebanon, Ohio. My wife Ruth and I were attending an Apple Festival in Lebanon, and yes there was a Muscle Car Show going on too. We were just walking along, then suddenly my wife said to me "look over there" and parked down the side street next to a local pub was parked a MGB GT British Green. It had a small For Sale sign on the window and read "Looking for a Good Home" 1968 MGB GT with the personal contact information. I spent some time looking it over and taking a photo of the information. I was very anxious to call the number and find out if we could work a deal. I said to my wife "what do you think?" and I was amazed that she said "go for it". Well, I refocused on the festival again but the LBC I could not get it out of my head. We walked back again to look and it was gone already. Good thing I took a picture of the contact information. All was not lost as we ended up in the pub discussing

the LBC and what we could do.

The next day was a beautiful Sunday and we were headed to the pool. I was sitting in the sun thinking about the LBC so I made the call to the person that owned the MGB GT. I was able to hash out a deal with gentleman. The car was not his, but it was his wife's. She purchased it as a project car and started to have work done on it, but it was becoming a little more than she wanted to put into it. The good news is that the project was far enough along and was in a very decent shape to be an everyday driver for me and my wife. We ended up naming her "Little Green Eyes" after my wife who has the most beautiful green eyes.





I picked up the MGB GT and I started to clean it up and make it into a "Looker" under the daily driver cover. As I went through the car, I decided to send all the chassis numbers to The British Motor Industry Heritage Trust. If you are not familiar with this process you need to locate all the vehicle numbers such as Car, Chassis, VIN, Engine, Body, Gear Box, Rear Axle, and Commission Number. This was a treasure hunt in its own to decode and to find and gathered all the numbers to be sent to the BMIHT for review. As I remember it took about a month to receive the information back that I needed to certify "Little Green Eyes." The Certified Copy of the Factory Record proved to be that "All" parts matched the original factory records. It also stated that the vehicles date of build was 4/11/1968 and dispatched to USA on 4/18/1968. The Certified Copy of a Factory Record was issued to me on August 8, 2017.

My next adventure was to enroll in the CBCC (Cincinnati British Car Club). I was able to be a member with the CBCC for two years in which I was a good standing member and competed in the yearly car shows.

In early 2016 I had the opportunity to have my Little Green Eyes worked on and painted. I was working for a company that the owner was a big Muscle Car fan. So much so that the owner had a warehouse of cars and a bone yard of at least two or three vehicles as donors to finish one completed car. He had an engine shop, trim shop, chrome shop and paint shop. I was the plant manager of the facility that the warehouse was located. So, at lunch time I would go to the shops to see how the cars were transformed from mostly rust buckets to show cars that sold for high dollars at Mecum and Barrett Jackson Auctions. One day I asked the owner if he would consider painting my MGB GT, and to my surprise he said "Yes". Within a week he sent a car carrier to my home to pick up Little Green Eyes. It took about three months to complete the job. She turned out



beautifully decked out in British Racing Green. She looked as she just came off the show room floor.

Moving forward to September 2018, my wife and I decided to retire and move to beautiful South Carolina. The next phase of our lives was starting. Well, the first thing that I needed to do as we settled in was to find a British Car Club. I went online and found the British Car Club of Charleston (BCCC) and the rest was history. Both my wife and I enjoy our LBC and the BCCC members and activities.

So, this was my story and I enjoyed sharing with all of you. $\ensuremath{\textcircled{B}}$







The WINDSCREEN

LBC TECH by Frank Wissman

Tom Meservey's Austin- Healey Sprite Wheel Bearings

Tom Meservey reported a fair amount of play in his right front wheel of his Austin-Healey Sprite and picked up a set of bearings to rebuild both front axles. Gene Carter, Frank Neil, Will MacPhee, Dave Romanick, and Jolene Balboa all met at Tom's house. Once again Tom had great coffee and donuts waiting, and the car had the wheels off and was on jack stands when we arrived. Gotta love a catered event!

The first step is pulling the axle nut cotter pin out, which was as simple as taking long-nosed pliers and twisting the pin around the pliers. My first take is that it will be a bear to put the new pin in, too. With Tom holding the wheel locked with the brakes, the first axle nut came right off, we removed the brake caliper and the hub more or less popped off.

The inner and outer bearings were driven out and everything cleaned up while we review how to install the bearings. Tom had consulted with Darryl Beech who stressed that the bearing change was easy and the bearing spacer is critical, it absolutely must be re-installed. The first step is to pack the bearings with grease, which is as much fun as it sounds. Gene, in a fit of generosity, allowed me to pack the bearings while he fed the grease into the mess. It's actually easy and the bearings hold more grease than I expected. We double-checked that the wide flange of the race goes towards the middle and drove the bearing in



with a large socket. Next, the spacer was dropped in per the illustration from the **Moss Motors** catalog and the other bearing was prepped and driven in. Lastly, the inner seal was pressed in and we presented the hub to the axle and re-attached the caliper. We torqued the nut on with some **orange Loctite** and the castellations of the nut pretty much lined up with the hole in the axle. **Dave** pointed out that there is a side access hole in the hub, so the cotter pin simply is slid into place and bent over.

Checking the bearing feel as we re-assembled everything it seemed things were dragging, but we weren't sure if it was excessive as the wheel wasn't on. The next hub removal was pretty much the same, and **Gene** and I got into our rhythm of greasing the bearings. First one is installed in the hub and then the other. Except I left out the spacer.

The outer bearing looked like the



easier one to remove, and it was. OK, put the spacer in, re-install the outer bearing, and repeat installing the hub on the axle.

Except the same issue with brakes dragging was there on the left, too. The call is made to get new calipers, pads and lines. The team did the full rebuild and Tom has great brakes all around now.


